Palliative Care Consult Services Hospital Liaison and Aged Residential Care



New Zealanders are living longer, and our older population is growing faster than our younger population, bringing many challenges to our hospitals, disability, and aged care sectors. The number of people aged 65 and over doubled between 1988 and 2016 to reach 700,000. This number is expected to double again by 2043 to between 1.3 – 1.42 million. The number of people living at aged 85 and over is expected to grow significantly over the next 25 years, from 83,000 in 2016 to between 240-280,000 in 2043 – the fastest growing population group on the planet (New Zealand Aged Care Association, 2018).

A dedicated palliative care multidisciplinary team (MDT), work alongside staff at Nelson Hospital and in Aged Residential Care facilities (ARC) to provide a consultancy service to support the delivery of specialist palliative care, for all inpatients and residents.

The Education Team can support the MDT further by providing opportunities for palliative care education to build knowledge, to enhance skills and confidence of staff, family / whānau and caregivers providing care for those with a life limiting illness.

Nelson Tasman Hospice is dedicated to working with a diverse range of communities. Building compassionate communities and social networks that assists patients and families/whānau to care for their loved ones in a variety of settings, in the hospice, in hospital in aged residential care (ARC) or at home.

We provide palliative care and end of life education to health professionals and community workers and are keen to engage with grassroots communities to demystify death and dying.

Our education team with the support of our volunteer and multidisciplinary teams can work with you to facilitate conversations, co design workshops or seminars, to meet your needs using a range of approaches.

Syringe Driver Workshops Hospice, Aged Residential Care RN's & District Nurses

The programme assists registered nurses **(RNs) District Nurses (DN's) and enrolled nurses (ENs)** to obtain the skills and knowledge required to manage a syringe driver in their work setting. A pre programme workbook will be emailed to participants. Successful completion of a written test is required for certification.

Syringe Driver Workshops Nelson Marlborough Health RN's

Nelson Marlborough Health (NMH) RNs only, the programme will include the Ko Awatea LEARN Subcutaneous Fluids & Medication module. RNs are required to complete the NMH practical competency session and NMH on-line subcutaneous medication course for full NMH competency.

For NMH staff there is a different training module. The competency and update workshops provide the knowledge and practical skills required to manage a subcutaneous syringe driver in the practice setting and a knowledge of medicines for end of life symptom management. Successful completion of a practical assessment and a written test is required for certification.

Hospice New Zealand Fundamentals of Palliative Care

A new blended learning programme for 2022

This Hospice New Zealand (HNZ) programme provides the learner with a broad overview of how to provide palliative care to people with a life limiting illness and in their last days of life. The programme is delivered via a blended model of learning, consisting of **5 online modules** which include reflection exercises and **one workshop**.

Online Modules:

The online modules can be completed independently, with a certificate of completion available for each. ***Note:** To participate in a workshop, the online learning will need to be completed first. You will need to make your own account via Knowledge hub <u>https://knowledgehub.hospice.org.nz/</u>

- Essence This is a foundation module and is a **pre-requisite to enrolling in further modules** in the programme. It covers palliative care concepts and the culture of care
- The palliative care approach ONE module covering communication, ethics, and spirituality
- Managing pain and long-term illness **TWO** modules covering pain, other symptoms, and pharmacology. Chronic illness and dementia
- Care and support at the end of life ONE module covering last days of life, grief, loss, and caring for ourselves

The workshops build on the knowledge acquired from the online modules, therefore is it a requirement that **you complete the five online modules before you can enrol and attend the workshop. The workshop** will be held at Hospice and will provide the opportunity for interactive discussions, sharing stories and reviewing case studies.
